### **Story of Change**

Ms. Anitha, a 23-year-old woman with a genetic disorder that caused her to be a dwarf, faced numerous challenges in her quest for economic independence and employment. After the unfortunate loss of her father, with her mother's ailing health and limited income, Anitha desired to start her own business without relying on others. Determined to succeed, she enrolled in an Entrepreneurship Development Programme (EDP) training, which provided her with the necessary support and materials worth Rs. 70,000 to kickstart her venture.

Anitha decided to focus on trading and renting imitation and artificial jewellery, a business she could efficiently manage from home. To promote her products, she circulated photos within her village's WhatsApp group, accepting orders for bridal makeup and festival decorations. The rental price for her jewellery sets ranged from Rs. 1,000 to Rs. 1,500 per day, depending on the set's value. Additionally, she began selling other daily-use artificial jewellery with a minimum margin of 40%.

Encouraged by the positive response from her village, Anitha expanded her marketing efforts by sharing her product catalogue with neighbouring villages through her classmates and well-wishers. Within two months, her business was generating an additional income of Rs. 4,000. Overwhelmed with gratitude, she now plans to set up a small shop in front of her house to showcase her products, providing a convenient space to manage both her business and household responsibilities while attracting more customers.

Anitha's newfound confidence has empowered her to face the challenges of life and provide for her mother's care. She expresses deep gratitude for the support she has received, as it has given her the opportunity to shape her own destiny.

#### Reducing Anaemia Prevalence in Ballia District - Alkem Laboratories

A lkem Laboratories partnered with CARE India to decrease the prevalence of anaemia among various target groups, including children in the age group of 6 to 59 months, adolescents, reproductive-age women (including pregnant and lactating women), and women beyond their reproductive years in Ballia district of Uttar Pradesh. To achieve this goal, there will be an emphasis on enhancing the testing, treatment, and monitoring of anemic patients in the selected areas. Additionally, efforts will be made to strengthen the regular intake of iron and folic acid supplements amongst pregnant and lactating women. Steps will be taken to improve public awareness regarding anemia. Foster a better comprehension of the condition within communities, encourage the adoption of nutritious

eating practises, and highlight the significance of maintaining proper sanitation to prevent anaemia. Public health facilities will be improved to provide better services for childbirth and contraception, as well as the management of severe anaemia cases. The project also includes population enumeration, training healthcare workers to use digital methods for anaemia screening, ensuring the availability of liquid form iron and folic acid supplements, conducting deworming campaigns, promoting behavioural changes related to diet and sanitation, providing menstrual education and care, and involving district officials in the planning and implementation process.
